



Dirt to Pave

The recent project on Harrison Road focused on enhancing infrastructure and improving transportation flow along its 1.59-mile stretch. Before the paving process, essential drainage improvements were undertaken to ensure long-term road stability and prevent water-related damage. This included the installation of new drainage pipes beneath the roadway. These preemptive measures aim to improve safety and durability, ensuring a smoother and more reliable route for local residents and commuters alike.
